

INFORMATION ON THE NEW INSURANCE POLICY

SOME DIFFERENCES IN THIS NEW PROGRAM:

1. Bring a Friend Days – any skaters who attend as “Friends” are not covered under this program. They cannot be added to the Commercial General Liability policy unless they become Skate Canada members. They can, however, be added to the Accident policy at a cost of \$2 per person. If you wish to have this event you must contact BFL Canada and purchase the coverage for these skaters. You need to estimate how many you’ll have – buy the coverage – and the day of the skate have each “Friend” sign in so that you have their name. It is important to note that the payment of the premium must be made prior to the date of the event. 2. Competitions/Test Days that use volunteers who are not registered with Skate Canada, are covered under the Liability Policy only. If you want them to be covered for the Accident Policy (if something happens to them due to an accident while acting on behalf of your Club whereby they have medical expenses that need to be covered) then you should purchase the coverage which can be done the same way as above.
3. All Skate Canada Club activities including normal Fund Raising events are covered under the liability policy. “Normal” fundraising events are car washes, ticket selling at malls, promotions, tag days, alcohol-free dances, etc. Any extra events such as Carnivals, Pop Concerts, Competitions need to have a sanction. Sanction forms are available from your Region Chairman.
4. Blanket Sanctions are to be obtained by Clubs who have skaters that go to hockey games as flag bearers or who perform solos between periods. If the skaters are promoting the sport of figure skating on behalf of Skate Canada then they are covered by our insurance as long as the Club has submitted their Blanket Sanction to their Region Chairman.
5. If there is a claim to be made please contact your Region Chairman for a copy of the claims form or BFL Canada directly.
