Open to members of CNCR sanctioned clubs or invited clubs only.

REGISTRATION:

SKATERS MUST REGISTER PERSONALLY at least ONE HOUR before their scheduled event unless it is the first event of the day in which case one half hour before their scheduled event. Further details will be included with your confirmation of entries.

MUSIC:

Cassettes or CD's must be turned in at the time of registration or your entry may be cancelled and no refund given. Music must conform to standard specifications for Cassette Tapes/CD's as listed below.

Each competitor is requested to have available TWO separate cassettes or TWO CD's (1 for backup cassette). The host committee will accept NO responsibility for damage but will take every precaution to safeguard each submitted cassette tape / CD.

STANDARD SPECIFICATIONS FOR CASSETTES/CD's

1. Only one (1) program shall be recorded on each cassette or CD.
2. Start of the music shall be recorded a max. of 3 seconds following the head leader.
3. Competitor's name, event and home club followed by MUSIC TIMING (not skating time) shall be clearly printed on one side of the cassette/CD.
4. Cassette tape or CD shall be enclosed in its original container.
5. Maximum length of cassette shall be C-60 or less.

ICE SURFACES: Memorial Arena – 85 x 200... with slightly rounded corners
Kin Arena – 85 x 200... with slightly rounded corners

ADMISSION: Will be free of charge to all.

EVENT MARKING: Semi open OR closed marking may be used, at the discretion of the Referee. Judging system will be 6.0 As per Skate Canada Regulation Change 9, April, 2003, only the final result will be posted.

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. Closing date of entry is midnight February 11, 2008, and all entry forms must be completed and in the hands of the registrar BEFORE MIDNIGHT of this date.
2. Skaters may enter only one event in each discipline of singles, pairs, dance, skills, and interpretive. **Skaters entering multiple events do so with the understanding that there may be scheduling conflicts that cannot be resolved.**
3. Event Composition: In normal circumstances, each category at the competition must be held for ladies and men separately. It is permissible for events that do not progress skaters on to a subsequent level of STARSkate Interclub competition to combine events as follows.
 - a) Combine two or more categories in the same event when each category has fewer than three entries;
 - b) Combine two or more categories in the same event when one category has insufficient entries to hold the event;

The decision to combine events is at the discretion of the Technical Representative, Chief Referee and the Host Committee. In any of the above cases, categories may be combined only with full prior knowledge and agreement of all competitors affected.

Note: In BC/YT Section competitions, men and women will compete against one another in Skills and Interpretive events.

4. The skating order shall be drawn by lot and may be drawn by computer for the initial round for the first or only portion of an event.
Except as noted, draws will be made in accordance with Skate Canada Rules.
5. Should entries in any competitive event be exceedingly large, the event will be divided into smaller groups by lot, which may also be drawn by computer. STARSkate groupings and LOC events will be divided according to age; Interpretive events divided by level of free skate test level first and if further grouping is required, by age. All events will be final.
6. Skating up one event from which you are qualified is permitted (except where noted) but must be **clearly** indicated on the registration form.
7. **WARM UP TIMES FOR SINGLES, DANCE AND PAIRS WILL BE:**

Canskate, Elementary, Pre-Preliminary, Skills, All LOC Events	3 Minutes
Interpretive (all categories)	4 Minutes
Preliminary Freeskate	4 Minutes
Pre-Juvenile, Junior Bronze - Gold Free Skate	5 Minutes
Juvenile and higher Competitive Events	6 Minutes

All Dance events will be governed by Skate Canada Rules.

The duration of the warm up periods may be reduced at the discretion of the referee to a minimum of three minutes. All warm-up periods for one event must be equal.

8. Tests passed and age shall be as of closing date of entries for STARSSkate and LOC events. All Competitive Stream events age shall be as of July 1, 2007 and tests as of closing date of entries.
9. Confirmation of entry and a schedule of events will be sent to each club after the closing date of entry.
10. **NO REFUNDS WILL BE GIVEN AFTER THE CLOSING DATE OF ENTRIES OF THE COMPETITION FOR ANY REASON WHATSOEVER.**
11. **ATTENTION ALL COACHES:** It is mandatory for all participating coaches to register at competitions and show their accreditation at all times during the competition in order to be at ice level during the event. Temporary accreditation will be issued by showing current Skate Canada membership and First Aid information for \$25.00.
12. Parents will NOT be allowed in the dressing rooms however the competition committee will provide a “common area” where parents can be with their skaters before they compete to put on their skates, etc.
13. Should there be only one entry in an event, the skater(s) may choose to be evaluated by one judge or skate up one level, or withdraw and the entry fee will be refunded. No evaluation for LOC events.
14. **Registration Entry Restriction: ALL SKATERS ENTERING CNCR INTERCLUB COMPETITIONS ARE RESTRICTED TO ENTERING THREE (3) EVENTS PLUS ONE TEAM EVENT.... (PLUS SYNCHRO IF OFFERED)**

Team Maneuvers -(per team)	\$36.00

NOTE- The \$3.00 surcharge per skater MUST be included with the entry fee.

The Local Organizing Committee of the Totem Interclub Competition has the right to charge a \$5.00 administration fee for any incomplete or incorrectly completed competition registration forms.

PROTOCOLS

Each participating club will receive a complimentary protocol BUT THIS PROTOCOL MUST BE ORDERED IN ADVANCE using the order form supplied. These complimentary protocols must be picked up at the conclusion of the competition – they will not be mailed unless \$5.00 postage has been included with the protocol entry form. The cost of additional protocols will be \$10.00 each. An order form is included with this announcement.

BULLETINS & NOTICES

All official announcements, schedules and results will be posted in the arena lobby. The starting time of each event will be posted and that schedule will supersede all other schedules. The posting of notices on this board will be considered sufficient notification to competitors.

Skaters must be present and ready to compete at least one (1) hour prior to event.

AWARDS

The Awards presentations time schedule and location will be posted on the arena bulletin board.

Medals will be presented to all 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place competitors.

Ribbons will be presented to the 4th, 5th, and 6th place competitors in the Canskate, Elementary and Pre-Preliminary Freeskate events.

TEAM TROPHY

A Team Aggregate Trophy will be awarded to the club acquiring the most points during the competition. Point system for aggregate award will be as follows.

- A. Four entries or more: 1st place-5 points...2nd place-3points...3rd place-1 point
- B. Three entries: 1st place-3 points...2nd place-1 point
- C. Two entries: 1st place-2 points

NOTE: The association and/or sponsors undertake no responsibility for damage or injuries suffered by skaters. As a condition and in consideration of their entries in the competition, all competitors and their parents or guardians shall be deemed to agree to assume all risk or injury to said competitors, to agree with the conduct and the management of the competition and to release all claims they may have against the officials, the association and the Mile 0 Figure Skating Club and their officials. Entries will be accepted on this condition only.

EVENTS TO BE SKATED

STARSKATE EVENTS

All StarSkate events will be judged according to the Well-Balanced Program Requirements. The Well Balanced Program chart is provided with this announcement.

NOTE: To balance group sizes events may be broken into groups according to age at the discretion of the Competition Committee.
Groupings for interpretive events will first be decided according to level of Free Skate test passed and then by age.

FREE SKATE EVENTS

EVENT # 1 ELEMENTARY LADIES 9 & UNDER

EVENT # 2 ELEMENTARY LADIES 10 & OVER

EVENT # 3 ELEMENTARY MEN

Competitors must not have passed the Preliminary Free Skating Test or any portion thereof. Must be 1st year competitors. Jumps must be no higher than a loop jump. (This means no flip, lutz or axel). These jumps, if attempted, will receive no credit. In addition, a deduction of 0.2 will be taken in the first mark for each forbidden jump. First year competitor means that a skater may compete in this event for a 12 month period starting with the first competition in which they compete. A skater may not enter the same competition in this category more than once. This one year restriction does not apply to skaters who are seven years of age or younger as of the closing date for entries nor to skaters who are registered with Special Olympic programs.

One free skating program to music of 1.5 minutes (+/- 10 seconds) in length.

EVENT # 6 PRE-PRELIMINARY MEN

Competitors must not have passed the complete Preliminary Free Skating Test.

One free skating program to music of 1.5 minutes (+/- 10 seconds) in length which must meet the STARSkate Well Balanced Program Requirements included in this announcement.

EVENT # 7 PRELIMINARY LADIES 10 & Under

EVENT # 8 PRELIMINARY LADIES 11 & Over

EVENT # 9 PRELIMINARY MEN

Competitors may have passed the Preliminary Free Skating Test but not the complete Junior Bronze Free Skating Test nor any portion of a free skating test higher than Junior Bronze. One free skating program to music of 2.0 minutes (+/- 10 seconds) in length which must meet the STARSkate Well Balanced Program Requirements included in this announcement.

EVENT # 10 JUNIOR BRONZE LADIES 12 & Under

EVENT# 11 JUNIOR BRONZE LADIES 13 & Over

EVENT # 12 JUNIOR BRONZE MEN

Competitors may have passed the Junior Bronze Free Skating Test but not the complete Senior Bronze Free Skating Test nor any portion of a free skating test higher than Senior Bronze. One free skating program to music of 2.5 minutes (+/- 10 seconds) in length which must meet the STARSkate Well Balanced Program Requirements included in this announcement.

EVENT # 13 SENIOR BRONZE LADIES

EVENT # 14 SENIOR BRONZE MEN

Competitors may have passed the Senior Bronze Free Skating Test but not the complete Junior Silver Free Skating Test nor any portion of a free skating test higher than Junior Silver. One free skating program to music of 3.0 minutes (+/- 10 seconds) in length which must meet the STARSkate Well Balanced Program Requirements included in this announcement.

EVENT # 15 JUNIOR SILVER LADIES

EVENT # 16 JUNIOR SILVER MEN

Competitors may have passed the Junior Silver Free Skating Test but not the complete Senior Silver Free Skating Test nor any portion of the Gold Free Skating Test. One free skating program to music of 3.5 minutes (+/- 10 seconds) in length which must meet the STARSkate Well Balanced Program Requirements included in this announcement.

EVENT # 17 SENIOR SILVER LADIES

EVENT # 18 SENIOR SILVER MEN

Competitors may have passed the Senior Silver Free Skating Test but not the complete Gold Free Skating Test. One free skating program to music of 3.5 minutes (+/- 10 seconds) in length which must meet the STARSkate Well Balanced Program Requirements included in this announcement.

EVENT # 19 GOLD LADIES**EVENT # 20 GOLD MEN**

Competitors may have passed the Gold Free Skating Test.

One free skating program to music of 3.5 (ladies), or 4.0 (men) minutes (+/- 10 seconds) in length which must meet the STARSkate Well Balanced Program Requirements included in this announcement.

INTERPRETIVE

Vocal music is allowed at all levels, there are no age restrictions and the skating time for all events is a minimum of 2.0 minutes to a maximum of 3.0 minutes.

It is important that your skating time is listed on your entry form to help with scheduling. Skaters must submit, prior to the competition, a brief statement of the chosen theme, to be no more than 70 characters in length.

EVENT # 21 PRE-INTRODUCTORY INTERPRETIVE

Competitors must not have passed any Skate Canada Interpretive or Artistic Test.

EVENT # 22 INTRODUCTORY INTERPRETIVE

Competitors must have passed the Introductory Interpretive test but no higher interpretive test.

EVENT # 23 BRONZE INTERPRETIVE

Competitors must have passed the Bronze Interpretive, Bronze Artistic or Adult Artistic Test but no higher interpretive test.

EVENT # 24 SILVER INTERPRETIVE

Competitors must have passed the Silver Interpretive or Silver Artistic Test but no higher Interpretive test.

EVENT # 25 GOLD INTERPRETIVE

Competitors must have passed the Gold Interpretive or Gold Artistic Test.

COMPETITIVE EVENTS**SINGLES**

Event Specifications are according to the Skate Canada Pre-Event Technical Package and ISU Communications 1445 and 1449. Skaters and Coaches should refer to these documents for more detailed information. EVENT # 26 PRE-JUVENILE WOMEN

EVENT # 27 PRE-JUVENILE MEN

Must have passed the complete Junior Bronze Free Skating Test or higher. Competitors shall be under the age of 11 for Women and under the age of 12 for Men, as of July 1st, 2007. One free skating program to music of 2.5 minutes (+/- 10 seconds) in length. The composition of the free skating program must meet the Skate Canada Well-Balanced Program Criteria

EVENT # 28 JUVENILE WOMEN

EVENT # 29 JUVENILE MEN

Must have passed the Juvenile Competitive Singles Test or higher. Competitors shall be under the age of 12 for Women and under the age of 13 for Men, as of July 1st, 2007. One free skating program to music of 2.5 minutes (+/- 10 sec) in length. The program must meet the Skate Canada Well-Balanced Program Criteria

EVENT # 30 PRE-NOVICE WOMEN – SHORT PROGRAM

EVENT # 31 PRE-NOVICE MEN – SHORT PROGRAM

Must have passed the Pre Novice Competitive Singles Test or higher. There is no age requirement. A short program to music that shall not exceed two (2) minutes, 30 seconds in length, containing the elements as listed in the 2007-2008 Pre-Event Technical Package. **Note that Men will skate the elements listed in Group B – sit spin with one change of foot**

EVENT # 32 PRE-NOVICE WOMEN – LONG FREESKATE PROGRAM

EVENT # 33 PRE-NOVICE MEN –LONG FREESKATE PROGRAM

A free skating program to music of 3.0 minutes (+/- 10 seconds) in length. The composition of the free skating program must meet the Skate Canada Well-Balanced Program Criteria

EVENT # 34 NOVICE WOMEN- SHORT PROGRAM

EVENT # 35 NOVICE MEN – SHORT PROGRAM

Must have passed the Novice Competitive Singles Test or higher. There is no age requirement. A short program to music that shall not exceed two (2) minutes, 30 seconds in length
Ladies: Short Program containing the elements as listed in the 2007-2008 Pre-Event Technical Package
Men: Short program containing the elements as listed in the 2007-2008 Pre-Event Technical Package.

EVENT # 36 NOVICE WOMEN- LONG FREESKATE PROGRAM

EVENT # 37 NOVICE MEN – LONG FREESKATE PROGRAM

Must have passed the Novice Competitive Singles Test or higher. There is no age requirement. A free skating program to music of 3.0 (women), 3.5 (men) minutes (+/- 10 seconds) in length. The composition of the free skating program must meet the Skate Canada Well-Balanced Program Criteria.

JUNIOR and SENIOR EVENTS

Junior and Senior events will conform to the specifications for the 2007-2008 ISU Competitions. For additional information for Junior and Senior categories please consult both the Skate Canada and the ISU websites for updates and relevant Communications.

EVENT # 38 JUNIOR WOMEN –SHORT PROGRAM

EVENT # 39 JUNIOR MEN – SHORT PROGRAM

Must have passed the Junior Competitive Singles Test or higher. Must meet ISU Junior age criteria - Women and Men must be under the age of 19 as of July 1, 2007. A short program which shall not exceed 2 minutes, 50 seconds in length containing elements to music as listed in **Group 1 (A)**

*Note that the combination spin may only have one change of foot

EVENT # 40 JUNIOR WOMEN – LONG FREESKATE PROGRAM

EVENT # 41 JUNIOR MEN – LONG FREESKATE PROGRAM

A free skating program to music of 3.5 (women) or 4.0 (men) minutes (+/- 10 seconds) in length. The composition of the free program must meet the Skate Canada Well-Balanced Program Criteria

EVENT # 42 SENIOR WOMEN – SHORT PROGRAM

EVENT # 43 SENIOR MEN – SHORT PROGRAM

Must have passed the Senior Competitive Singles Test. There is no age requirement. A short program that shall not exceed 2 minutes, 50 seconds in length, containing the elements to music as listed in the Technical Handbook.

EVENT # 44 SENIOR WOMEN – LONG FREESKATE PROGRAM

EVENT # 45 SENIOR MEN – LONG FREESKATE PROGRAM

A free skating program to music of 4.0 (women) or 4.5 (men) minutes (+/- 10 seconds) in length. The composition of the free program must meet the Skate Canada Well-Balanced Program Criteria.

LOC EVENTS:

SINGLES

EVENT # 46 CANSKATE LADIES

EVENT # 47 CANSKATE MEN

Competitors must be working on their Canskate Program Badges. Must not have any jump higher than a toe loop (this means no loop, flip, lutz or axle) If attempted, these jumps will receive no credit. In addition, a deduction of 0.1 will be taken in the first mark for each forbidden jump. **Skating time: 1.0 minutes (+/- 10 seconds) to music.**

SHOWCASE SINGLES EVENTS

In this event the skater may create his/her own program and music may be vocal or instrumental. It is a fun event whereby the skater has the privilege of creating their own show. Difficulty of jumps and spins are not required elements. Costumes and accessories are encouraged. Skaters may use small props but no props are to remain on the ice. Props may be carried or attached but **MUST NOT** be set down during the skater's performance – non-compliance will result in disqualification.

Male and female skaters will compete against each other in this event.

NOTE: SKATERS MAY ENTER SHOWCASE ONLY IF THEY HAVE NOT ENTERED AN INTERPRETIVE EVENT

EVENT # 48 CANSKATE SHOWCASE

Competitors must be working on their Canskate Badges.
Music time: 1.0 minutes (+/- 10 seconds)

EVENT # 49 ELEMENTARY SHOWCASE

Competitors must not have passed the Preliminary Free Skating Test nor any portion thereof.
Music time: 1.0 minutes (+/- 10 seconds)

SIMILAR PAIRS EVENTS

PLEASE NOTE: The Similar Pairs events listed below are open to two ladies or two men who will compete in the same event. Vocal music is allowed.

EVENT #50 PRE-PRELIMINARY SIMILAR PAIRS

Each competitor must not have passed any part of any Freeskate test.
Music Time 1.5 minutes (+/- 10 seconds).

EVENT #51 PRELIMINARY SIMILAR PAIRS

Each competitor must have passed the complete Preliminary Freeskate but no higher.
Music Time – 1.5 minutes (+/- 10 seconds).

EVENT #52 JUNIOR BRONZE SIMILAR PAIRS

Each competitor must have passed the complete Junior Bronze Freeskate but no higher test.
Music Time – 1.5 minutes (+/- 10 seconds).

EVENT #53 INTERMEDIATE SIMILAR PAIRS

Each competitor must have passed the complete Senior Bronze Freeskate Test

but no higher test Music Time – 2.0 minutes (+/- 10 seconds).

EVENT # 54 SENIOR SIMILAR PAIRS

Each competitor must have passed the complete Junior Silver Freeskate Test OR any higher freeskate test. Music Time – 2.0 minutes (+/- 10 seconds)

ELEMENTS PROGRAM

Each skater will complete the four required elements listed, in no particular order. This event shall be open to both men and ladies who will compete together. Program to be skated in a choreographed manner WITHOUT music, using just one half of the ice surface. Field movements and connecting steps are permitted to link the elements. Additional elements or repetition of elements that have failed are not permitted. Rotational movements of more than one full rotation shall be considered extra elements. Small jumps of not more than half a turn may be included in the step sequence.

EVENT #55 PRIMARY ELEMENTS PROGRAM

Competitors must be registered in and working on their Canskate Program Badges.

SPECIFICATION FOR EVENT: Program length **not to exceed 1 minute.**

One-half of the ice surface to be used. Elements to be skated:

1. Salchow Jump
2. Two foot spin
3. Waltz jump/Toe Loop–Jump Combination
4. Series of 2 Bunny hops followed by a drag.

EVENT #56 PRE-PRELIMINARY ELEMENTS PROGRAM

Competitors must not have passed the elements portion of the Preliminary Freeskate test. SPECIFICATION FOR EVENT: Program length **not to exceed 1 minute.**

One-half of the ice surface to be used. Elements to be skated

1. Flip Jump
2. Sit Spin (minimum 2 rotations)
3. Flip/Toe Loop–Jump Combination
4. Forward Spiral on a curve.

EVENT #57 PRELIMINARY ELEMENTS PROGRAM

Competitors must have passed the entire Preliminary Free Skate test but no portion of a higher Free Skate test. EVENT SPECIFICATIONS: Program length **not to exceed 1 minute. One-half of the ice surface to be used.**

Elements to be skated

1. Loop Jump
2. Backward Outside Spiral
3. Camel/Sit Spin (min 2 rot. in each position)
4. Flip/loop Jump combination

EVENT # 58 INTERMEDIATE ELEMENTS PROGRAM

Competitors must have passed the entire Junior Bronze Free Skate test, but no higher. EVENT SPECIFICATIONS: Program length **not to exceed 1.5 minutes.**

The full ice surface will be used.

Elements to be skated.

1. Double Salchow
2. Straight Footwork Sequence (end to end)
3. Axle/Loop Combination
4. Flying Camel (4 rotations)

EVENT #59 SENIOR ELEMENTS PROGRAM

Competitors must have passed the entire Senior Bronze Free Skate test OR higher.
EVENT SPECIFICATIONS: Program length **not to exceed 1.5 minutes.**

The full ice surface will be used

1. Double Lutz
2. Serpentine Footwork Sequence
3. Double Toe/Double Loop Combination
4. Flying Sit Spin Combination Spin

TEAM MANEUVERS

Open to men and ladies who will compete together. All team maneuver events to be composed of four (4) skaters. Each skater will do one element of their choice from the elements provided. All elements must be skated. Teams must enter with 4 skaters to compete. In the case that one skater becomes sick or withdraws from the competition the team may compete with 3 skaters (one skater will complete 2 of the elements) At the discretion of the Chief Referee, skaters competing in Team Maneuvers may skate UP one category in order to complete a team composition (skater MAY be permitted to skate on 2 teams). Decision will be made after reviewing the clubs' team rosters and concluding that there are no other options available in order to field a team. Maximum 1 skater per team may be considered for this exception. A team stroking / warm up period will be provided prior to start.

EVENT #60 PRE BEGINNER TEAM MANEUVERS

Skaters must be registered in the Canskate Program. Four Elements to be skated:

1. Series of three Bunny Hops
2. Waltz/ Toe Loop Combination
3. Forward Spiral
4. Two Foot Spin

EVENT #61 BEGINNER TEAM MANEUVERS

Skaters must not have passed any part of a free skate test.

- Four Elements to be skated:
1. Forward Spiral on a curve
 2. Waltz /Toe-loop Combination
 3. Salchow Jump
 4. Sit Spin

EVENT #62 LEVEL 1 TEAM MANEUVERS

Skaters must have passed Preliminary Free Skate but no higher complete test

- Four Elements to be skated:
1. Lutz jump
 2. Backward Outside Spiral
 2. Camel Spin
 3. Flip/Loop Combination

EVENT #63 LEVEL 2 TEAM MANEUVERS

Skaters must have passed Junior Bronze Free Skate Test but no higher complete free skate test. Four Elements to be skated:

1. Double Salchow
2. Ina Bauer
3. Sit change Sit Spin
4. Axle/Loop Combination

EVENT #64 LEVEL 3 TEAM MANEUVERS

Skaters must have passed Senior Bronze Free Skate Test but no higher complete free Skate test. Four Elements to be skated:

1. Outside to Inside Spiral-change of edge in spiral position
